INTRODUCTION

The St. Charles County Stray Book (1813-1821) and the Record of Marks and Brands (1809-1822) are contained within the same volume in the St. Charles co, MO courthouse. The clerk merely turned the book upside down and inverted it to make his entries in the correct list. The information included here comes from the original handwritten volume. Every name in these records is indexed using the spelling that was used by the clerk or justice of the peace when entering the original affidavit. Language barriers, limited education and just plain old bad handwriting have resulted in multiple ways of spelling last names. For instance, a name as simple as John Brown is listed as John Browne and Jonne Bronne. A creative mind-set is a prerequisite when using the index, so be inventive!

St. Charles County Stray Book

The following affidavits were filed by William Christy, Jr., Clerk from 1809 through January 1813, and from March 1815 through 1822. Uriah J. Devore served as clerk from February 1813 through January 1815. The page numbers given are the page numbers found in the original volume.

Nov 25, 1811 Taken up by Antoine Janis, one cow...a crop and slit in her left ear, supposed to be three years old; also one black gray cow...a crop and slit in her left ear, supposed to be three years old and with her, a sucking calf, the whole appraised to \$16.00 by Josep Yott and Lee Cohn. Daniel Colgan, J.P.

Jan 26, 1810 Taken up by Mary Brown, living at Bonnhomme Point, District of St. Charles, one steer, four years old...marked a crop and slit in the left ear and an under slit out of the right, appraised to \$10.00. Also, one bull, about three years old...with a crop of the left ear, appraised to \$5.00. Elisha Goodrich, J.P.

Mar 13, 1812 Taken up by Oliver Cottle, a red heifer, two years old...marked with a crop and hole in the left ear and a half crop in the right ear. Appraised to \$5.50. Biel Farnsworth, J.P.

Jul 7, 1810 Taken up by William Savage living on Lutre near the Lick in the District of St. Charles, one brown bay mare...branded on the rear side and flank with two small rakes about two inches apart, extending from the hip towards the foreleg, on the off side the same, and on the right Buttock "A.C." and on the off shoulder "O", aged 10 years old, appraised to \$20.00. Also, one bay horse...three years old, appraised to \$40.00 before me, by Anthony C. Parmer and Delany Boles and William Hays. John B. Callaway, J.P.

Feb 18, 1811 Taken up by madam Relief Cottle, 5 head of cattle. One steer 5 years old past...marked with a slit in the right ear, appraised to \$8.00. One Do, three years old...appraised at \$6.25. One brown-spotted heifer, a year old past, appraised at \$5.00. One dun heifer a year old past... appraised at \$5.00. One red calf...appraised at \$2.50. Biel Farnsworth, J.P.

Jul 8, 1812 Taken up by Joseph Hands, District of St. Charles, Femme Osage twp, one bay horse, 9 years old...branded on the near shoulder thus [looks like an upside down "2"], appraised to 35 dollars by William Smith and Boone Hays. John B. Callaway, J.P.

Feb 26, 1813 Came to the plantation of the subscriber in the month of December, one heifer...marked with a crop in the left ear and two half bits out of the right ear from the underside, appraised; to \$7.00 by James Green and James Tagert. Isaac Lemasters. William Christy, Jr., Clk. C. Com. Pleas

Aug 22, 1811 Taken up by Colgan, a sorrel horse, about 6 years old, branded on the near shoulder "Cy", same brand on the near buttock reversed, appraised to \$20.00 by Timothy Kibley and Saml Paul Lacroix. William Christy, a Justice for the township of St. Charles.

Nov 11, 1813 Taken up by David Weaver of the twp of Lower Cuivre, one white cow and calf. Cow marked with two under half penny bits out of the under side of each ear. Appraised at \$16.00 by Robert Thomas and John Walker. Samuel Watson, J.P.

Dec 1, 1812 Taken up by Robert Johnson, living in the district of St. Charles on Dake waters, one red steer...marked in the left ear with a crooked slit...supposed to be three years old, appraised to \$9.50 by John McKiemy. John B. Callaway, J.P. for Femme Osage twp.

Nov 11, 1813 Taken up by Rene Pallardy, township of Dardenne, one steer, three years old...branded on the near buttock "E.D.", marked with a swallow fork in both ears, appraised to \$8.00 by Antoine Lemarche and Louis Calloubre. R. Pallardie "+" his mark. William Christy, J.P.

Nov 11, 1813 Taken up by Robert Spencer, living on Dardenne, one cow, four or five years old...appraised at \$8.00 by John Ferry and John Adain Smith by virtue of an order from William Christy, J.P.

Nov 11, 1813 Taken up by John McKurny, District of St. Charles on Sharette Creek, one steer, supposed to be four years old...marked with a half crop out of the upper side of each ear, appraised to \$12.00. Also a heifer, supposed to be two years old...appraised to \$6.00. John B. Callaway, J.P.

Nov 26, 1811 Taken up by R. Zumwalt, one steer, three years old...a crop of the right ear and a swallow fork in the left ear, appraised to \$7.00. Also, a cow and calf...appraised at \$7.00. Biel Farnsworth, J.P.

Sep 9, 1812 Taken up by Lewis Chancilier, a cow, three years old...a crop off the right ear and a swallow fork in the left with a young calf, appraised to \$7.00. William Christy, Jr., J.P.

Feb 6, 1813 Taken up by Daniel Colgan, Sr., one brown steer, three years old...appraised at \$5.00. Also one bull, two years old, a crop and hole in the right ear and a slit in the left ear...appraised at \$4.00. One other bull...three years old with a crop and slit in the left ear and a slit in the right ear, appraised at \$6.00. Also, one other red heifer, two years old ...appraised at \$4.00. Also, one brown steer, two years old with a crop off each ear, appraised to \$4.00. All of these cattle were appraised by Peter Journey and Joseph Journey. Daniel Colgan, J.P.

Feb 1, 1813 Taken up by Stephen Best of the township of Portage Des Sioux, a red cow and two calves, one a yearling, the other a two year old...cow is marked a slope and under bit in the left ear and a swallow fork in the right, appraised to \$12.00. E. Ayres, J.P.

Feb 11, 1813 Taken up by James Flaherty, Jr., a bay horse...supposed to be three years old last spring...appraised to \$30.00 by Peter Journey and Joseph Journey. Daniel Colgan, J.P.

Sep 6, 1813 Taken up by Isaac Best, a small bay mare, 7 or 8 years old...appraised to \$20.00, branded on the near shoulder, "J.T." and on the buttock, "E.R." and on the right shoulder with an "E.H." Christopher Talbott, J.P.

Nov 27, 1813 Taken up by Robert Lyles, township of upper Cuivre, one bay mare...6 years old. Also, a sorrel colt about 8 months old. Appraised to \$36.00. Joseph Cottle, J.P.
